Interim Conditions v3.6; with effect from 2 October 2021; Ministry of Health.

Key Changes from v3.5 – For countries on the restricted list, travel on commercial flights is allowed henceforth; quarantine on arrival remains 7 days, with day 5 PCR testing.

Visitors to Seychelles

	Procedures and Conditions ¹
Pre-Travel	• Entry from All Countries, except Bangladesh, Brazil, India, Nepal and Pakistan.
	Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure.
	Complete Health Travel Authorisation at <u>seychelles.govtas.com</u> .
	• Valid Travel & Health insurance to cover COVID-19 related quarantine, isolation or treatment.
	• Entry/stay conditions will not be affected by COVID-19 Vaccination status; but visitors are strongly
	encouraged to be fully immunised before travel.
Arrival and Stay	Stay in any certified tourism establishments.
	• Need <i>not</i> take a routine Day 5 surveillance PCR test ² .
	No minimum length of stay in first establishment.
Notes	• Visitors who have been in Bangladesh, Brazil, India, Nepal and/or Pakistan in preceding 14 days will not be permitted entry into Seychelles.
	• Conditions for stay for children up to age 17, regardless of their vaccination status, will be as for the parent/guardian they are accompanying.
	• All visitors must report any illness at any point during stay to hotel management and public health authority for further evaluation.
	• Anyone tested positive, and/or assessed to be a close contact, will be required to undergo isolation or quarantine as per national protocols.
	• Diplomats on short-term official work-visits to Seychelles follow conditions as for Visitors.

Pre-Travel	May enter from any country.
	• Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure from country of origin.
	Complete Health Travel Authorisation.
Arrival and Stay	 No quarantine required, except when entering from Bangladesh, Brazil, India, Nepal or Pakistan (Restricted list of countries).
	• Day 5 PCR test is required.
	• Where entering from a country in the restricted list: a 7-day quarantine in an approved
	establishment or home-quarantine is required, with day 5 PCR test.
Notes	• Conditions for Children up to age 17 will be as for their accompanying parent/guardian.
	• All individuals arriving in Seychelles must report any illness to their local health centre and/or public health authority, even if vaccinated.

Pre-Travel	 May enter from any country, except countries on the restricted list. Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure from country of origin. Complete Health Travel Authorisation. Cover for COVID-19-related health costs: testing, quarantine, isolation, treatment. 	 Countries on the restricted list are Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Pakistan. Entry from Brazil is not allowed at present. Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure from country of origin. Complete Health Travel Authorisation.

Entry by Sea to Seychelles (by Yachts)

	Procedures and Conditions
Pre-Travel	 Apply by e-mail to <u>pha@health.gov.sc</u> for Health Travel Authorisation. Valid Travel & Health insurance to cover potential COVID-19 related costs.
Arrival and Stay	 Spend at least 14 days at sea from last port of call. All crew and passengers should be without symptoms of COVID-19 during this period. No need for Arrival or Day 5 PCR test. Earlier disembarkation is allowed provided all crew undertake a COVID-19 PCR test (at cost) upon arrival, with all results negative.
Notes	 All visitors/crew must report any illness during stay to hotel management and/or public health authority for further evaluation. Conditions for entry of diplomatic or military vessels will be based on discussions with Public Health Authority, through Department of Foreign Affairs.

Seafarers (by Flight⁴)

	Procedures and Conditions
Pre-Travel	 May enter from any country, except for Brazil. However, seafarers wishing to enter from a country on the restricted list must follow conditions as for GOP-holders entering from these countries. No pre-travel quarantine required. Negative COVID-19 PCR test done within 72h of departure from country of origin. Complete Health Travel Authorisation.
Arrival and Stay	 Valid Health insurance to cover any potential COVID-19 related costs. No guarantine required on arrival (except for arrivals from countries on the restricted list).
	• Encouraged to directly board vessels and depart as soon as possible after arrival. Where there may delays, a day 5 PCR test (at clients'/employers' cost) is indicated.
	• For arrivals from countries on the restricted list, please refer to and follow as directed in section on GOP-holders arriving from countries on the restricted list.
	 Daily surveillance as per protocol with Rapid Antigen Test⁵ aboard vessel is encouraged.
Notes	• Any seafarer showing symptoms of COVID-19 illness during their stay/work must report it to relevan supervisors and/or company doctor.
	• Any suspect cases must be immediately reported to Port Health using standard forms.
